STEM LIST

While the number of words in the Latin dictionary is large, the number of frequently occurring stems is not. Familiarity with them is one of the best means to enlarge a beginner's vocabulary, especially when used together with a study of prefixes and suffixes. Stems and prefixes undergo, however, certain sound changes according to their environment. The sounds, and therefore the spellings, of many Latin words and their English derivatives are determined by *vowel weakening* and by *assimilation*. By reference to meaning and sound changes you will learn to recognize the stems of many Latin words.

Vowel Weakening

Vowel weakening is a universal feature. For example, the vowel *a* in the English word *land* is weakened in the compound *England*. In the compound word *Newfoundland* the vowels in both *found* and *land* are weakened so that the word is pronounced something like *Newf'ndl'nd*. In Latin there are four main patterns of vowel weakening. These can be observed in some of the compound words to be entered in the stem list.

- short *a* becomes *i*, e.g., *ca*do --> inc*i*do
- short *a* becomes *e*, e.g., *capio captus--> recipio*, rec*eptus*
- short *e* becomes *i*, e.g., lego --> colligo
- *ae* becomes *i*\, e.g., *cae*do --> inc*i*\do

Assimilation

Assimilation is most obvious in compound words where prefixes assimilate (i.e., become similar) to the initial consonant of a stem with which they are compounded. The very word *assimilation* is a compound of the prefix *ad*- and the stem *simil*. This explains variations like *adduco*, *accurro*, *affero*, *assisto*, *attendo*, all of which have the prefix *ad*-. A combination of vowel weakening and assimilation explain words like *acceptus* where *adcaptus* would be expected.
